

(1) Reading resources in Samoan, Tokelauan, Tongan, Cook Island and Niuean: Parents please click on the link below for Pasifika dual language books. (27 stories)

- Download and open the story and read it in your own language to your child/ren and then they can read you the English version.
- Ask your child/ren questions about the story to see if they have understood what they have read.
- Have them copy the sentence and then read it to you.
- Children could write down words from the story that end in 'ed' or 'ing'. Then they can write their own sentence using the word.
- The book 'Splish Splash' has 8 poems. Children can read and copy the poem. They can then underline/circle 'verbs' - a doing or action word e.g: jumped, sing, walked, etc... 'noun' - a name of a place, person or a thing e.g: Place - home, office, school, Fiji, etc... Person - girl, boy, man, Mr Smith, John, etc... Thing - pencil, an apple, car, etc...
- Note: there is also audio of the story that your child can listen to by themselves.
