The theme for Samoa Language Week is "Tautua i le alofa, manuia le lumana'i" which means "Serve in love for a blessed future."






Next week on Thursday 30th May, we will be celebrating Samoan Language Week by inviting all students to come to school dressed in their Samoan attire.
