
If the cost is a concern for families, we can provide assistance through Children's Variety Charity.

ATTENDANCE FOCUS

We love it when our students come to school and we worry when they don't. We know this is a hard time and some absences may be due to illness or challenges experienced in school or the community. It may be stressful getting back into a routine of attending school every day

but we need you to please do your best to ensure that your child attends school every day, setting them up for a good education and ensuring your child has success at school.

At the moment our attendance data is very concerning and too many children are staying home for no justified reason. We are also noting that some children are only attending school 2 or 3 days a week which is disruptive to their learning.

All the research proves that students who are regularly absent from school and/or late for school do not achieve their full potential and are more likely to fall behind in their learning compared to those students that attend regularly.
