HOW IS MATARIKI CELEBRATED?


The twinkling of the Matariki stars in the pre-dawn sky heralds a special celebration for young and old. Across Aotearoa, people come together to remember their ancestors, share food, sing, tell stories and play music. Matariki festivities highlight the Tangata Whenua view of the world. They remind us of the cycle of life and natural ways of marking the passing of time.

REMEMBERANCE

Matariki, as a marker of transition, was a natural time for families to mourn and honour those who had passed away in the previous year.

These loved ones were believed to have transformed into stars – te hunga kua whetūrangitia – shining down from the heavens.

CAUGHT BEING GOOD ASSEMBLY


